Thank you for completing the survey! Here's how to **calculate and interpret your responses** to assess church health effectively:

Step-by-Step Score Calculation

1. Total Scores per Category

- o Add up your ratings for each statement in Messenger, Missionary, Minister, and Mentor
- o Each category has **8 statements**, so the maximum score per category is: 8 times 5 (Strongly Agree) = 40
- o If all four sections have a balanced score, your church is at the growing stage (healthy church)

2. Overall, Church Health Score

o Combine all four category scores: 40 (Messenger) + 40 (Missionary) + 40 (Minister) + 40 (Mentor) = 160 total possible points

3. Optional: Category Averages

- o Divide the score for each category by 8 to get an average rating (1 to 5)
- o This helps reveal which areas are thriving and which need attention

HOW TO INTERPRET THE SCORES

Average Score per Category	Meaning
4.5 – 5.0	Strong area of spiritual health and vitality
3.5 – 4.4	Healthy but could benefit from support
2.5 – 3.4	Moderate—needs intentional growth
1.0 – 2.4	Weak—requires immediate prayer and strategy

- Use the insights to shape strategic plans, sermons, and mentoring efforts
- Invite the Holy Spirit to guide each next step in strengthening His church
